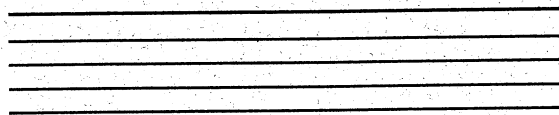

Edward D. Benson, conductor

Ed Benson attended school in Rocky Mount, NC and NC State College before entering the Armed Services in 1944. He received his BS in Music Education from East Carolina in 1950 and, after a brief tour with the Bob Astor Orchestra from New York, he entered Teacher's College, Columbia University from which he received an MS degree in Music Education in 1952. His teaching experience includes band and choral duties in New Bern, NC and Fuquay Springs, NC, where he taught band, chorus, and general music. Mr. Benson moved to Asheville, NC in 1960 where he served as Music Supervisor and Band Director in two Junior Highs and the Senior High. In 1965, he moved to Charlotte, NC where he again became Band Director in two Junior Highs and the Senior High. In 1968, he began the duties of Instrumental Coordinator for the Charlotte/Mecklenburg School System, a position he held until retirement in June of 1997.

Mr. Benson served on the first NC State Band Curriculum Committee as well as the Music Instrument Standards Committee for NC. He has held the offices of Vice-President and President of the NC Bandmasters Association, has received the Twenty-five Year Service Award of the NC Music Educators and the Outstanding Music Educator Award of the South Central District, and has served as an adjudicator and clinician in North and South Carolina.

He is the author of a handbook entitled, "Band Techniques I Wish I'd Known Sooner", concerning teaching aids, suggestions and observations collected over some forty-seven years in music education.

Larry Wells, conductor

Larry Wells is the director of bands at Northwestern High School in Rock Hill, SC. The bands at Northwestern have a strong tradition of excellence and have been awarded the South Carolina Outstanding Performance Award for the past 11 years. The Symphonic Band is a consistent Grade VI Superior band and was the featured performer at the 2001 SC Music Educators Conference. The Symphonic Band is one of six bands at Northwestern. Others include three concert bands, two jazz bands, a marching band, and various woodwind, percussion, and brass ensembles. The Purple Regiment Marching Band is a Bands of America finalist and was ranked in the top 12 at the Bands of America Regional in St. Louis. In addition, the Purple Regiment is a consistent finalist in the South Carolina State 5A Marching Championships. In 2001, they finished fourth.

Mr. Wells is a member of SC Music Educators Association, Music Educators National Conference, American School Band Directors Association, and Pi Beta Mu. He has served as President of the South Central District Band Association in North Carolina and as Secretary of the North Carolina Bandmasters Association. Mr. Wells has received the North Carolina Band Masters Award of Excellence and the Citation of Excellence. He is an active clinician and adjudicator for both concert and marching bands throughout the Southeastern United States.

Stanley F. Michalski, Jr., conductor

Having forged a distinguished career of some forty-five years as a conductor, educator, performer and clinician/adjudicator throughout North America and Europe, Dr. Stanley Michalski is currently serving as the Coordinator of Instrumental Music for the Diocese of Charlotte, NC and is also adjunct professor of music at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, SC, where he is the associate conductor of the Winthrop University Olde English Symphonic Wind Ensemble. As a tuba soloist, clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor, Michalski has conducted/performed in forty-two states, Australia, Canada, Mexico, Japan and Europe. His conducting experience has brought him to the podium for such noted ensembles as the United States Air Force Band, the United States Marine Band, the United States Army Band, the Armed Forces Bicentennial Band, and the United States Army Field Band. As an author, Michalski has published numerous articles on music education, bands, and low brass. Michalski earned his Bachelor of Science degree as a cum laude graduate from Pennsylvania State University where he later earned the Master of Music and Doctor of Education degrees. Dr. Michalski's professional memberships include the American Bandmasters Association, Phi Beta Mu, Kappa Kappa Psi, the College Band Directors National Association, and lifetime honorary member of the Pennsylvania Collegiate Bandmasters Association. In 1992, Michalski was appointed to the clinician and artist staff of United Musical Instruments USA, Inc. Michalski's career sparkles with accolades of success including: Emeritus Professor of Music and Conductor of Bands at Clarion University of Pennsylvania, Supervisor of Music for the Harrisburg, PA and Mifflintown, PA public schools, the Clarion University Student-Alumni Golden Eagle Award, Certificate of Commendation from the American Federation of Musicians, a Citation of Commendation from the Pennsylvania State Legislature, one of Ten Most Outstanding Music Directors in 1976 by The School Musician Journal, Distinguished Faculty Award at Clarion University, the A. Frank Martin Award of Kappa Kappa Psi in 1985, an Honorary Diploma of Honor from the La Casa De La Cultura De Acapulco, the Kappa Kappa Psi Distinguished Service to Music Award, and the naming of the instrumental rehearsal room in the Marwick-Boyd Fine Arts Building at Clarion University for him in 1995.
